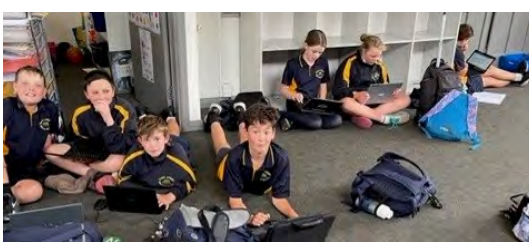

Dear parent, grandparent and friends,

I hope this finds you well. A touch of warmer weather again this week, which has been fantastic.

On Monday evening, our School Council met for our November meeting. During the meeting, our team reviewed the 2024 Annual Implementation Plan and Cash Budget. It was one of our longer meetings for the year; however, it was a fortuitous that we were able to spend the time unpacking our strategic direction for 2024. I thank our School Council members for their support of our amazing school. Outlined below is a very brief summary of some of the main areas of focus for Dana Street Primary School, for next year.

In Literacy and Numeracy, we will continue our journey to deeply embed our Phonics and Morphology programs, which have been very successful this year. Reading will continue to be one of our main areas of focus for professional development of staff as we look to continue the excellent results we have achieved this year. Numeracy will also continue to be a focus for our staff, with plans to provide more authentic and challenging investigative learning opportunities for our students. A Numeracy Community Evening something we are keen to facilitate in 2024. Through a Wellbeing lens, we will build on our suite of resources to support students as they navigate the sometimes complex work we live in. We also want to further identify opportunities for community involvement and celebration of learning, which have been successful aspects of this year. I am excited for 2024, but acknowledge that we have much to do before the year is finished.

In this week's newsletter there is information regarding the parent payment for 2024. There are FAQs that we would really like you to look at, as the Parent Payment document template that we are mandated to use is sometimes difficult to navigate. 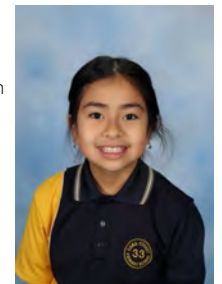

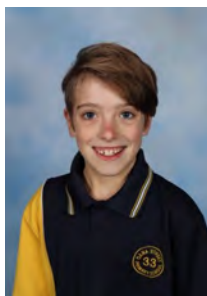

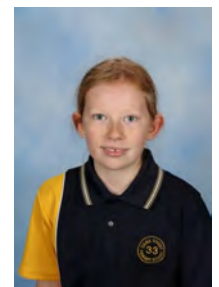

## What is Extra Curricular Payment vs Curricular Contribution ?

**Curricular Contribution** is voluntary. DSPS is only seeking contribution to 2 major whole school events. Your contribution will see a real connection to the activity and will significantly enhance the event for your child/ren and school community.

**Extra-Curricular Contributions** ("User Pays") are for activities and events outside the school curriculum. Payment must be received before students can attend these activities. Please read the Excursion Planner that outlines most proposed activities in 2024 and their costs.

## How do I make payments for Extra Curricular "User Pays" activities ?

All Payments are via **SENTRAL** prior to the activity. Payment requests will appear alongside Permission notifications in **SENTRAL**. The 2024 Excursion Financial Planner aims to assist families in planning for excursion/activity payments likely to occur throughout the year. **The planner is only a guide and is subject to change.**

## What happens if I don't pay for the Extra Curricular "User Pays "activity?

A student whose account has not been credited with funds will not be able to attend the activity. The school welcomes payment plans that are set up prior to the event. CSEF is available to contribute to Camps and Excursions.

## Has parent payments changed?

Yes, in 2021 the Department of Education made significant changes to their parent payment policy. These changes created confusion for both schools and parents.

In 2024 we have created a clear schedule of payments distinguishing between Curriculum (Voluntary) and Extra Curricular payments.

# FAQ : SENTRAL | New in 2024

## What is SENTRAL?

**SENTRAL** is a secure school management system that Dana Street is adopting to streamline all aspects of school life. Most users utilise the PARENT APP which is downloaded onto your phone and is designed to be very user friendly.

## Why are we moving to SENTRAL?

SENTRAL offers parents a **One Stop Shop** for the management of your child's education. From reporting absentees, updating medical details, uploading plans, refreshing contact details, communicating with teachers, reviewing the school calendar, accessing the school newsletters, confirming permissions, making payments, scheduling teacher interviews to accessing digital copies of school reports – SENTRAL is the hub of all things Dana Street Primary School.

## Do I have to use SENTRAL?

**YES!** SENTRAL will be the school's primary communication method.

## When do I need to register with SENTRAL?

"Access Keys" will be sent home Week 10, Term 4 2023.

We encourage parents to register over the January holidays to receive important back to school information leading into Term 1 2024.

**All families must be registered with SENTRAL by Week 2, Term 1 2024 as Athletic Day details will be sent by SENTRAL.**

All parents/caregivers and guardians must register. There will be a transition period in early Term 1 2024 as we phase out paper/Class Dojo.

## Where/How do I register?

**How To Instructions** will be shared on the "Access Key" due home Week 10.

Parent Portal is via a website. Parent APP is via a downloaded APP.

## What is an "Access Key"?

Each parent is provided a personalised Access Key for the registration process. Access Keys will be sent home end of Week 10, Term 4. We can reprint if needed.

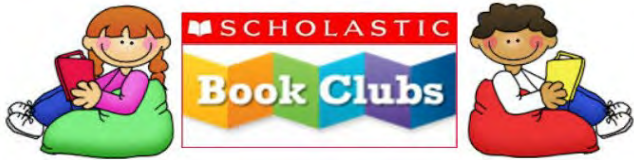
## I'm not IT savvy? Can you help?
