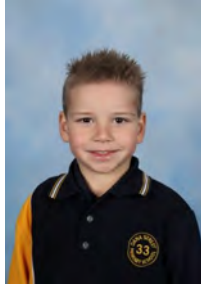
For the positive way you have applied yourself during our Maths investigations this week. Poppy, you should be so proud of the strategies and skills you have shown!

Rosie

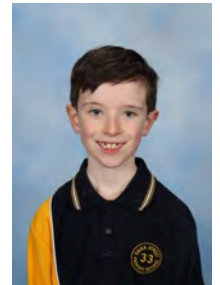
For having a 'can do' attitude this week. Rosie, you have been ready to lock into your learning and been able to give all lessons a red hot go! Keep up the great work!

Art

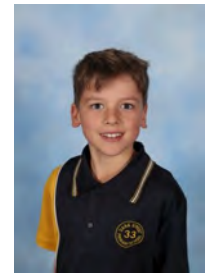
